Change Authority

A change authority is beneficial because it:

- Provides authority to make decisions about proposed changes
- Confirms change authorization before implementation
- Provides visibility in the change control process
- Provides a vehicle for impact analysis
- Facilitates resource allocation
- Plays an integral role in keeping the software development process under control

Consideration #1: Purpose & Scope

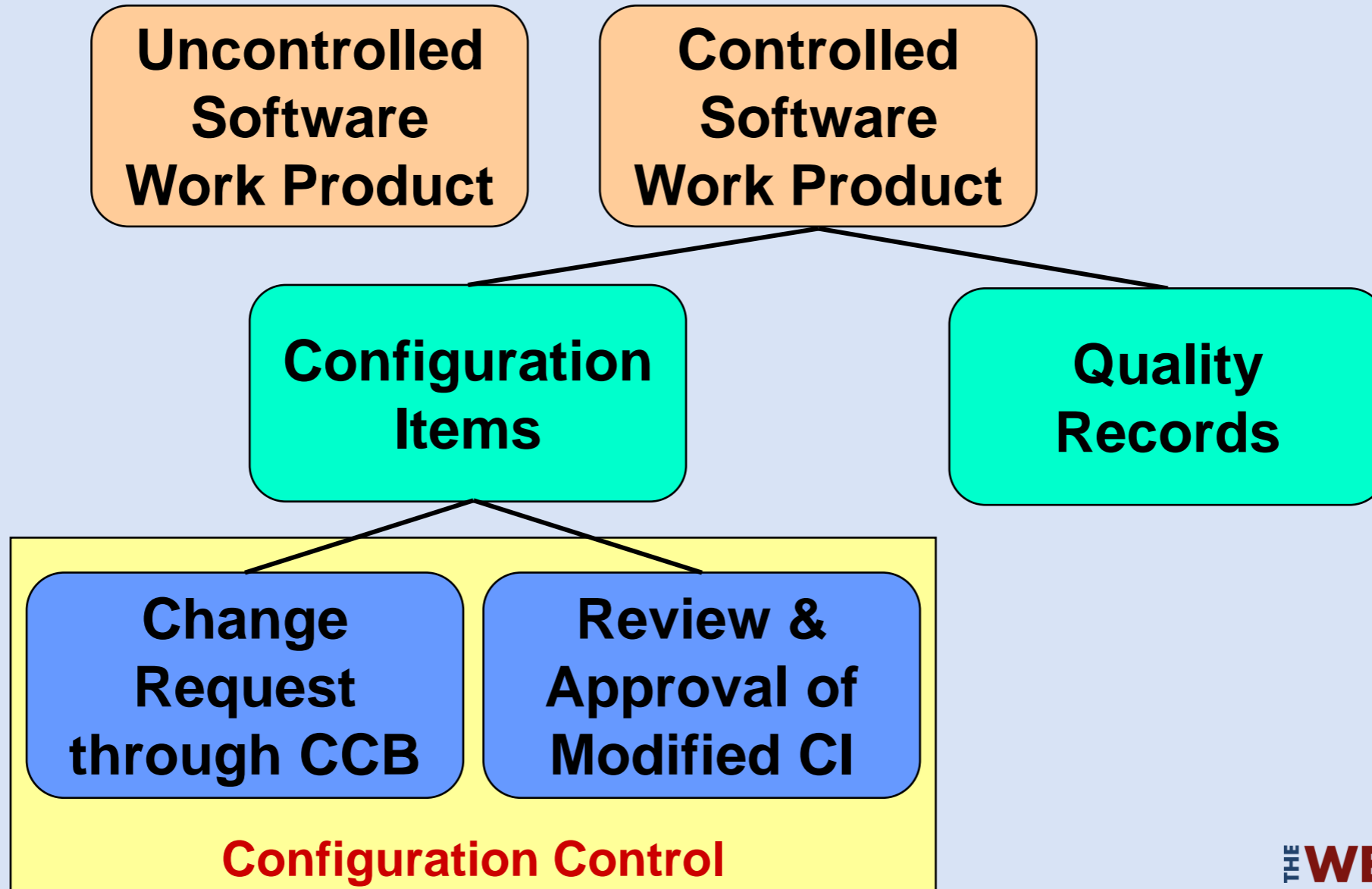
Purpose:

- The objectives of the change authority
- Its relationships to other change authorities within the organization & to other decision-making bodies

Scope of Authority:

- The decisions that the change authority can make
- What decisions need to be escalated to higher-level change authority

Controlling Software Configuration Items

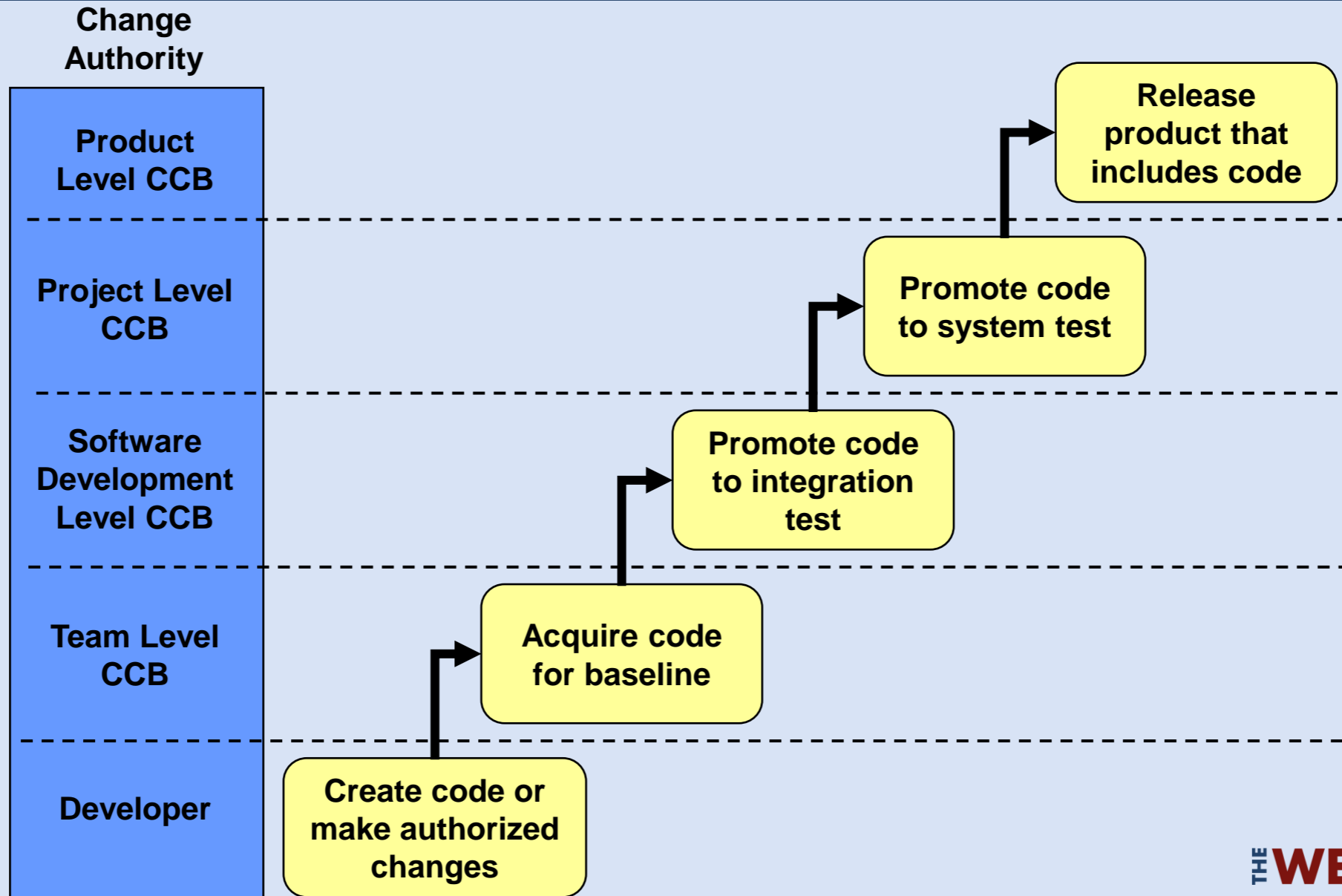


Consideration #2: Membership

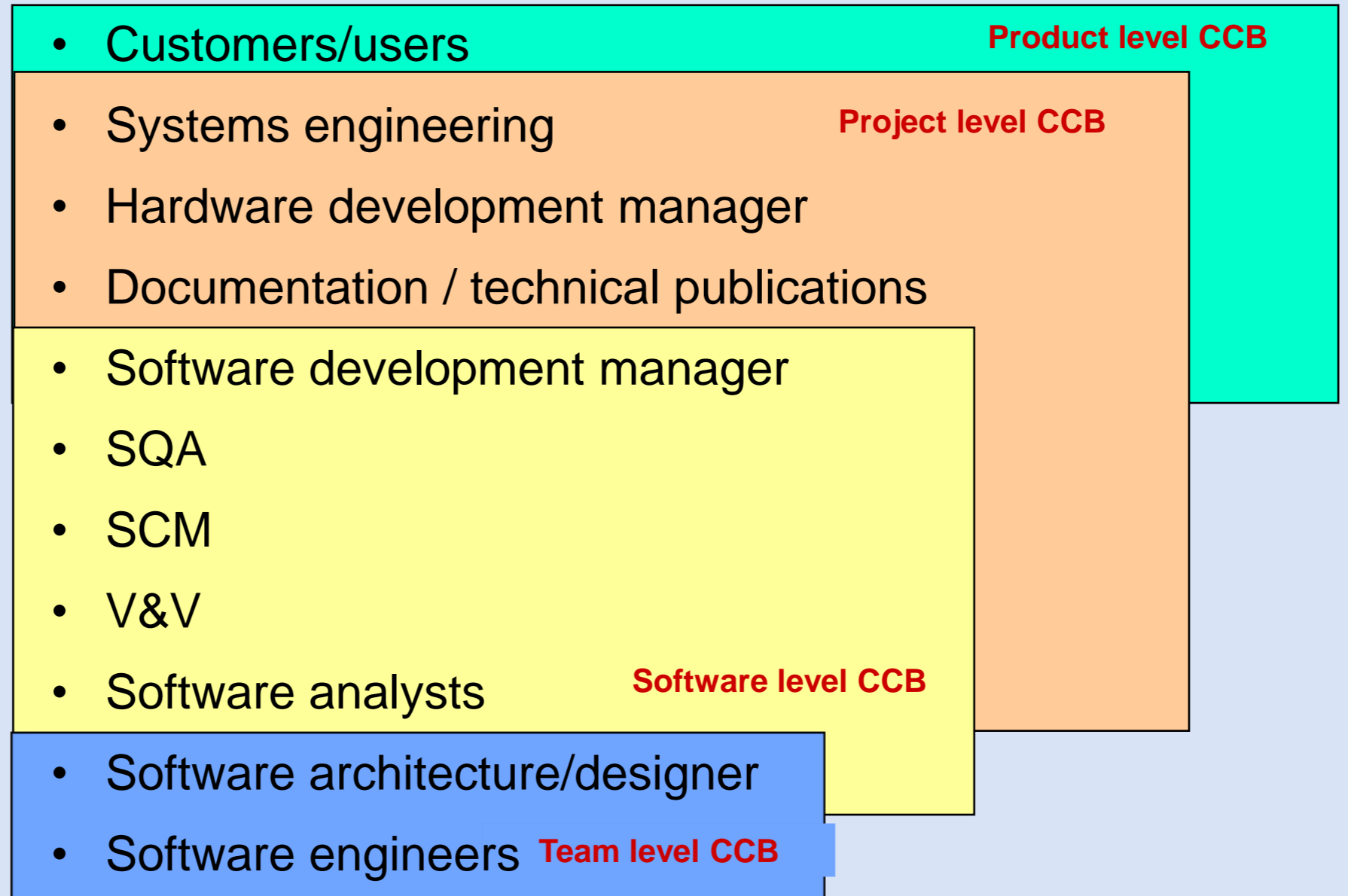
Potential candidates for Change Control Board (CCB) membership:

- Policy makers
- Technical specialists
- Project management
- Representation from impacted organizations:
 - Systems engineering
 - Software engineering
 - Hardware engineering
 - Documentation / technical publications
 - Quality assurance
- Customers, users & other stakeholders

Review & Approval of Modified CI

The change authority membership might be whoever is doing the review & approval:

- Peer review team
- Milestone review team
- Whoever is doing the gate review

Agile Change Authority

The change authority in agile may be the:

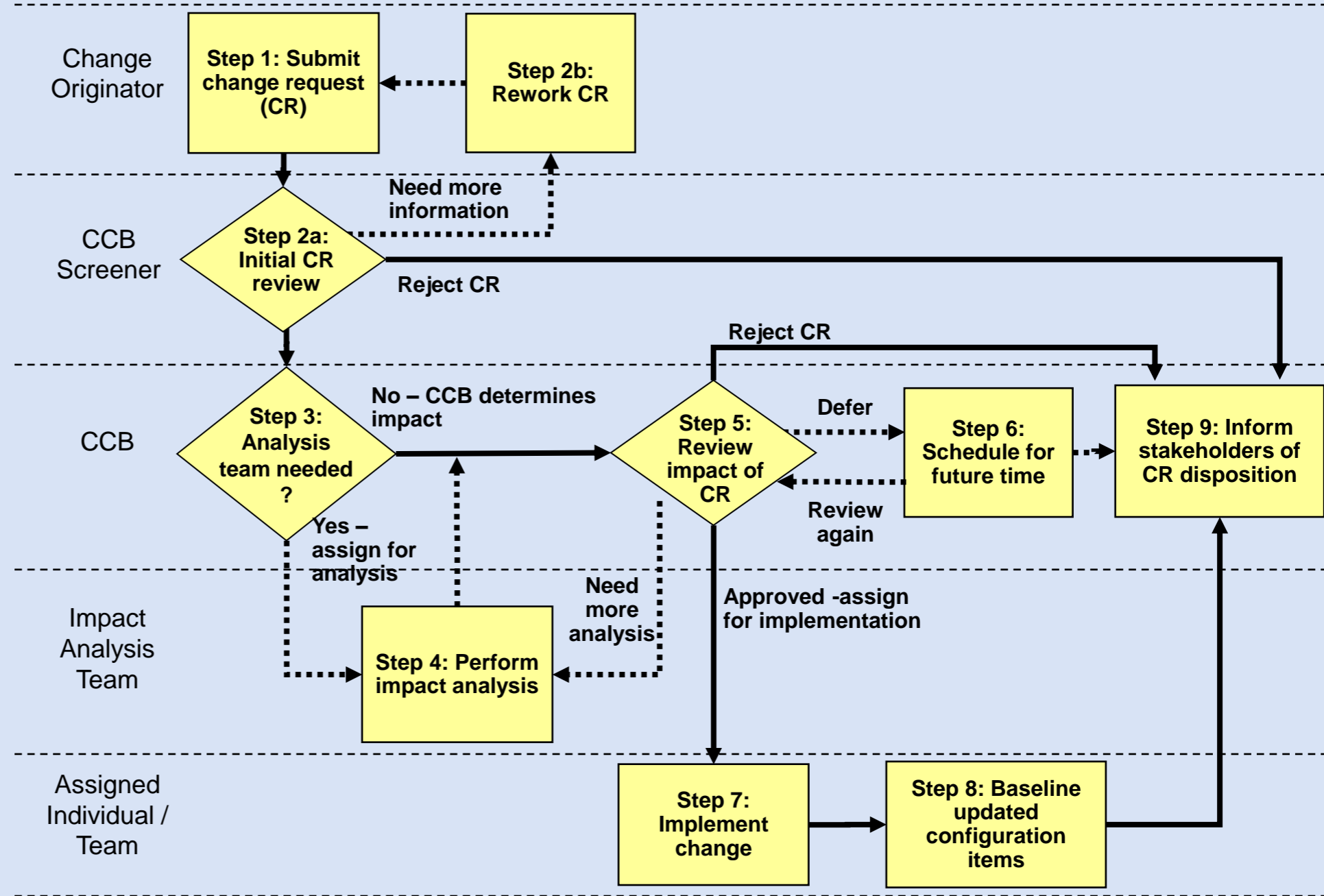
- Development team – during the iteration (sprint)
- Product owner – outside of the iteration (sprint)
- Backlog refinement meeting attendees
- CCB

Consideration #3: Operating Procedures

Operating procedures considerations should include:

- Frequency of meetings
- Criteria & procedures for calling special meetings
- Process for how meetings are conducted
 - Representatives process
 - Impact analysis process
 - Subject matter expert process

Consideration #4: Decision-Making Process

How the CCB makes its decisions.

- Vote: How do members not in attendance at a given meeting cast their votes?
 - Through a representative
 - By proxy
 - Via e-mail
- Consensus
- Leader has final decision-making authority with recommendations from other members

Consideration #5: Communications Mechanisms

How the change authority:

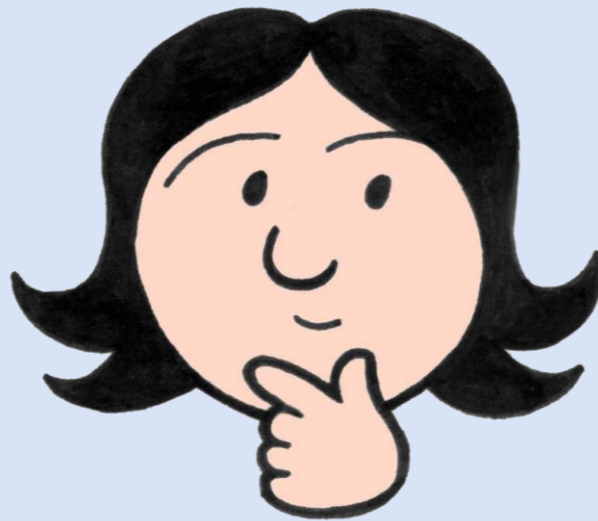
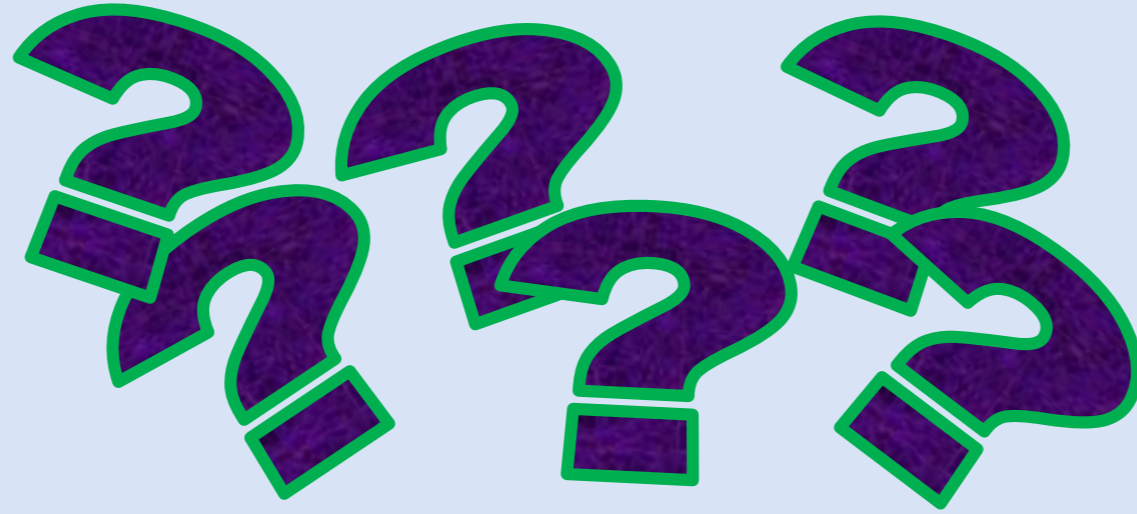
- Receive requests for change (enhancements & issues)
- Gather input from affected stakeholders
- Communicate its decisions to those stakeholders, including higher-level or lower-level change authorities
